## Purim, A Time for Celebration

At this holiday time, which falls in late February or early March (in the Hebrew month Adar), children run around costumed as beautiful Queen Esther, righteous Mordecai or regal King Ahasuerus. Purim time is party time. Along with the costumes and gaiety, the more fortunate traditionally give charity and donations of food to the needy.

As always at holiday times, special foods abound. Most popular are the little pastries called ozneh Haman, Haman's ears, or Hamantaschen which are supposed to represent Haman's three-cornered hat. The latter are triangular-shaped pastries that usually contain prune or poppy seed and honey fillings. These sweets are designed to remind us of the story of Purim as we recall how God turned the evil designs of wicked Haman into something good for the Jewish people.

During the Feast of Purim particular attention is paid to the events surrounding the holiday as recorded in the book of Esther. Traditionally the scroll must be read through at least once; but in many circles multiple readings are common.

There's a lesson in this for us all. Too often people expect God to intervene in their life situations in some mighty and miraculous manner. While God has often responded in just such a manner in Bible history, this is not always the case. The story of Purim reminds us that God also works in quiet and hidden ways in the circumstances and problems of human life.

The important lesson must be our assurance that God is always at work—seen or unseen—in his concern over the wellbeing of his people.
