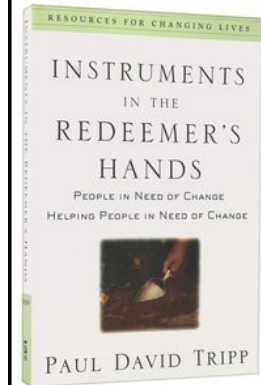

Reading Good Books



Instruments in the Redeemer's Hands by Paul David Tripp brings a refreshingly rich, practical and also theologically sturdy approach to ministering to people in need of change.

Immediately within the first 10 pages, we see the first benefit from

Tripp's book, which introduces us to the "Best of News" within God's Story. As we explain God's true story for all time and eternity, we are able to see how we fit into His story. His story is a true history derived from facts and documented throughout the Bible. The ingredients of our present condition (good and bad; right and wrong) are not new to any of us and God himself wants us to be aware of the true story. Within this framework, many concepts are revealed such as: God, time, creation, perfect harmony, stewardship, marriage, family, Satan, original sin, fear, self-sufficiency, murder, sin's ongoing effects, societal sin, hope, redemption, anticipation, promises, Kingdom, Messiah, Savior, eternity, etc. The drama builds from Old Testament to New Testament. The King of kings came once and offered us eternal life. He will come again and we will reign with Him forever. For us today and as we minister to others, "Change is possible because the King has come! In all this, God's ultimate goal is his own glory".

The second contribution I appreciated was the community concept of "speaking the truth in love" from chapters 11 & 12. This is grounded in the most basic of commandments, of loving God and then loving our neighbors. I capture this truth with an emphasis on the community. It is within this community of believers, the church, that we can be honest with one another and keep short accounts of sin through speaking the truth. In a sense, we build a culture that welcomes truth and grace wrapped in love for God and each other. This is essential to every believer and is God's way of fostering or continuing change in individuals within the community.
