

WHO PUT THE EVIL IN PRIMEVAL HISTORY?

Introduction:

"With irresistible power desire seizes mastery over the flesh.... It makes no difference whether it is sexual desire, or ambition, or vanity, or desire for revenge, or love of fame and power, or greed for money.... Joy in God is...extinguished in us and we seek all our joy in the creature. At this moment God is quite unreal to us, he loses all reality, and only desire for the creature is real.... Satan does not here fill us with hatred of God, but with forgetfulness of God.... The lust thus aroused envelops the mind and will of man in deepest darkness. The powers of clear discrimination and of decision are taken from us. The questions present themselves: "Is what the flesh desires really sin in this case?" I. THE SUBTLETY OF THE SERPENT (vs. 1-5)

- A. His Strategy (Revelation 12:9; 20:2)
 - 1) to plant doubt ("Indeed, has God said...?") Genesis 2:15-17
 - 2) to produce distortion ("...you shall not eat from any tree of the garden?")
 - 3) to promote denial ("you will not surely die")
- B. His Seduction (II Corinthians 2:11)
 - 1) He is crafty and deceptive, not straightforward.
 - 2) He challenges the authority of the Word of God.
 - 3) He impugns God's character.
 - 4) He contradicts the certainty of God's judgment.
 - 5) He promises pleasure but doesn't mention the pain.

II. THE RUIN OF THE RACE (vs. 6-7)

A. How does temptation work?

I John 2:15-16 - Do not love the world nor the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh ["she saw that the tree was good for food"] and the lust of the eyes ["and that it was a delight to the eyes"] and the boastful pride of life ["and that the tree was desirable to make one wise"], is not from the Father, but is from the world.

they "hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God"

"Where are you?"

B. God Confronts the Guilty Sinner

C. God Offers Reconciliation to the Guilty Sinner

woman: "the serpent deceived me...and I ate"
