Biblical Arguments:

1) Man's nature implies the need for capital punishment.

- 2) Human government is responsible for capital punishment.
- 3) Capital punishment was incorporated into the Mosaic Code.
- 4) the New Testament reaffirms capital punishment.

#### Theological Arguments:

- 1) Capital punishment was not abolished with the Mosaic Code.
- 2) Capital punishment is not ruled out by the New Testament ethic of love.
- 3) Capital punishment does not "send unbelievers to hell".
- 4) Capital punishment was not removed by Christ's work on the Cross.

### Moral Arguments:

- 1) The primary purpose of justice is punishment, not reform.
- 2) Capital punishment is a deterrent to crime.
- 3) Capital punishment is necessary to protect the sanctity of human life.
- 4) Capital punishment must be justly applied.
