In Colossians 1:13-14 we find 4 actions of the Father concerning our salvation for which we must join in praising Him.

- 1. The Father Rescued Us (13a)
- 2. The Father Transferred Us (13b)
- 3. The Father Redeemed Us (14a)
- 4. The Father Forgave Us (14b)

## THE FATHER RESCUED US (13A)

"darkness" (v. 13) vs "light" (v. 12)

God did not qualify us to His inheritance from a position of neutrality, but from a position of hostility.

"authority" (Ephesians 2:2; 2 Corinthians 4:4)

"transferred"

Exodus from Egypt

#### Exile in Babylon

## THE FATHER REDEEMED US (14A)

"redemption" = a price paid

The first Passover Christ's Passover

# THE FATHER FORGAVE US (14B)

"forgiveness"

"Having cancelled out the certificate of debt" (Colossians 2:14) "no condemnation" (Romans 8:1)

Legalism is a constant temptation for those who forget that they are free in Christ.

#### CONCLUSION

Unlike Operation Thunderbolt, God did not invade enemy territory to save His friends, but to save those who were hostile and rebellious agains Him and to transform them into friends and make them children of light and heirs with Christ.
